A list of documents for candidates for the second cycle studies

- 1. Printed and signed application for admission (available upon completion of on-line application)
- 2. **A copy of passport** (the original document must be presented when submitting documents at the Academy)
- 3. **A copy of visa or residence card** (the original document must be presented when submitting documents at the Academy)
- 4. **A copy of Polish Card** (the original document must be presented when submitting documents at the Academy) **not obligatory**
- 5. A proof of **health insurance** valid for basic medical care in Poland.
- 6. A **medical examination certificate** stating that the applicant has no medical restriction for training in the selected mode and field of study.
- 7. A proof of payment for entrance examination
- 8. **2 current photographs**, in accordance with requirements used when issuing Personal Identification Cards, signed overleaf and one photo as an electronic file.
- 9. **A copy of the secondary education certificate** stamped with Apostille¹ or legalized in a Polish Embassy in its country of origin (the original **document** must be presented when submitting documents at the Academy)
- 10. A **Bachelor's** or **Master's** Degree Studies certificate stamped with Apostille or legalized in a Polish Embassy in its country of origin (the original document must be presented when submitting documents at the Academy)
- 11. **A transcript of records** (a document which shows the academic achievements (subjects, grades, ECTS points)
- 12. **An official confirmation** of the certificate holder's eligibility for admission to second cycle studies at a higher education institution in the country of origin of the education certificate,
- 13. A certificate in Polish Language not obligatory
- 14. Candidates for following specializations are obligated to present:
 - Composition pieces composed by the candidate
 - Music education and animation a programme for conducting exam and a programme for vocal emission exam and scores for accompanist
 - Music ensembles and choral conducting a programme for conducting exam and a programme for vocal emission exam and scores for accompanist

¹ If the country of origin is a part of the Hague Convention Abolishing the Requirement for Legalization for Foreign Public Documents, the documents must have **an Apostille**.

- **Instrumental studies** (specializations: piano, harpsichord, organ, church music, guitar, accordion) a major instrument exam programme
- Instrumental studies (specializations: early instruments, violin, viola, cello, double bass, flute, oboe, clarinet, bassoon, saxophone, horn, trumpet, trombone, tuba, harp, percussion) a major instrument programme and scores for accompanist (having scores is essential for being provided with an accompanist from the Academy)
- **Solo singing** a programme for solo singing exam and scores for accompanist (having scores is essential for being provided with an accompanist from the Academy)
- Choreography a candidate's own choreographic pieces on a CD, which must be presented by the candidate for entrance examination.

- 1. A copy of the secondary education certificate stamped with Apostille or legalized in a Polish Embassy in its country of origin
- 2. A Bachelor's or Master's Degree Studies certificate

- 4. An official confirmation of the certificate holder's eligibility for admission to second cycle studies at a higher education institution in the country of origin of the certificate.
